## **The Complete Guide to Root Canal Treatment: What to Expect**

If your dentist has referred you for root canal treatment, it is likely that two questions are occupying your mind. First: will it hurt? Second: is saving the tooth actually worth it? The honest answer to both, in almost every case, is yes and yes — the treatment is far more comfortable than its reputation suggests, and keeping your natural tooth is almost always the right long-term decision.

This guide walks you through exactly what root canal treatment involves, what modern techniques have changed about the experience, and what you should know before your first appointment.

### **What Is Root Canal Treatment?**

Root canal treatment — formally called endodontic treatment — is a procedure that removes infected or inflamed tissue from inside a tooth, cleans and disinfects the internal canals, and seals the tooth to prevent reinfection. The goal is to save a tooth that would otherwise need to be extracted.

The 'root canal' refers to the natural cavity inside the root of a tooth, where the pulp — a soft tissue containing nerves, blood vessels, and connective tissue — is housed. When this pulp becomes infected or inflamed due to deep decay, a crack, or trauma, root canal treatment removes it, eliminates the infection, and allows the tooth to function normally without the nerve.

### **When Is Root Canal Treatment Needed?**

Root canal treatment is indicated when the dental pulp is infected or has died. Common triggers include:

- Severe toothache when biting or applying pressure
- Prolonged sensitivity to heat or cold that lingers after the stimulus is removed
- Darkening or discoloration of the tooth
- Swelling or tenderness in the surrounding gums
- A persistent pimple or abscess on the gum
- A cracked or fractured tooth exposing the inner pulp

In some cases, an infected tooth causes no pain at all — which is why regular dental X-rays are important. The infection can be identified on X-ray even when symptoms are absent.

## What Does the Procedure Involve?

### Assessment and Imaging

Before treatment begins, your endodontist takes detailed X-rays — and in complex cases, a CBCT scan that provides a three-dimensional image of the tooth's canal anatomy. This assessment determines the number of canals, their curvature, and the extent of infection. Accurate imaging is the foundation of effective root canal treatment. Rootcanal Foundation is equipped with a MORITA CBCT that is capable of taking the most accurate small field of view (40 X 40 mm) scans that minimize radiation exposure and provides accurate diagnosis.

**Anaesthesia** Local anaesthesia is administered before any instrument touches the tooth. Modern anaesthetic technique in the hands of a specialist achieves complete numbness reliably. The procedure itself is painless. The sensation patients feel during treatment is pressure and vibration — not pain. If you feel discomfort during the procedure, you tell your endodontist and more anaesthetic is given immediately.

### Access and Canal Shaping

A small opening is made in the top of the tooth to access the pulp chamber. The infected pulp tissue is removed using specialist endodontic files. In modern endodontic practice, rotary files — motorized, flexible nickel-titanium instruments — shape the canals with greater precision and in less time than traditional manual techniques. At RCF, rotary endodontics is standard practice.

### Irrigation and Disinfection

Once the canals are shaped, they are thoroughly irrigated with antimicrobial solutions — typically sodium hypochlorite — to eliminate bacteria throughout the canal system. This step is critical: a root canal that is mechanically clean but not chemically disinfected is at higher risk of reinfection. The irrigation phase at RCF uses irrigant activation techniques that improve penetration into the microscopic branches of the canal system.

### Obturation

The cleaned and disinfected canals are filled with gutta-percha — a biocompatible rubber material — and sealed with a root canal sealer. This fills the entire canal space and prevents bacteria from re-entering. A temporary or permanent coronal restoration is then placed to seal the access opening.

### Will It Hurt Afterward?

Some mild soreness and sensitivity around the treated tooth for 2–3 days after treatment is normal and expected. This is tissue inflammation resolving — not a sign that anything has gone wrong. Standard over-the-counter pain relief (ibuprofen or paracetamol) manages this comfortably for most patients.

Severe pain, significant swelling, or a fever after root canal treatment is not normal and should be reported to your endodontist. These are rare occurrences that require attention.

### Do I Need a Crown After Root Canal Treatment?

In most cases, yes. A tooth that has undergone root canal treatment has had its internal structure removed and is more brittle than a vital tooth. A crown protects the treated tooth from fracture, restores its full biting function, and seals the coronal access. Posterior teeth — molars and premolars — that bear significant biting forces almost always require a crown. Front teeth may be restored with a filling in some cases, depending on how much natural tooth structure remains.

At Rootcanal Foundation, prosthodontic planning begins at the same time as endodontic treatment — the restoration is considered from the outset, not as an afterthought.

## How Long Does Root Canal Treatment Last?

A well-performed root canal on a properly restored tooth can last a lifetime. Studies consistently show success rates of 85–97% at 10 years for initial root canal treatment. The most significant factor in long-term success is the quality of the coronal restoration — a crown that seals the tooth properly and protects it from fracture.

## Root Canal Treatment Cost in Chennai

The cost of root canal treatment varies based on the tooth being treated (front teeth have fewer canals than molars), case complexity, whether retreatment is required, and whether a CBCT scan is needed for assessment. A: An untreated infected tooth does not heal on its own. The infection will spread — to surrounding bone, to adjacent teeth, and in serious cases into the neck and jaw (a condition called Ludwig's angina, which is a medical emergency). Extraction becomes necessary, and the gap left by a missing tooth causes shifting of adjacent teeth and bone loss over time.

### Q: Can root canal treatment fail?

A: Root canal treatment has a high success rate but is not infallible. If symptoms persist or recur, retreatment — re-cleaning the canals — is often successful. In cases where retreatment is not viable, surgical options (apicoectomy) exist. We at Rootcanal Foundation will advise if your case carries any increased risk of failure.

## Root Canal Treatment Cost in Chennai — What Affects the Price

#### 1. Which Tooth Is Being Treated

The number of canals in a tooth is the primary cost driver. Front teeth (incisors and canines) typically have one canal. Premolars have one or two. Molars have two to four, and in some cases more. More canals means more time, more materials, and more technical demand — and therefore a higher fee.

#### 2. Case Complexity

A straightforward root canal on a previously untreated tooth with visible, well-shaped canals is a different clinical challenge from a retreatment — removing old filling material from a previously treated tooth — or a case involving calcified canals, curved roots, or a separated instrument from a prior procedure. Complex cases take longer, require more specialist skill, and cost more.

#### 3. Whether Specialist Care Is Required

A general dentist can perform routine root canal treatment. An endodontist — a specialist who has completed an additional three years of postgraduate training exclusively in root canal procedures — manages complex cases, cases that have failed elsewhere, and cases requiring advanced imaging or techniques. Specialist fees are higher than general dentist fees, and the outcomes for complex cases are significantly better.

#### 4. Imaging and Technology Used

A standard periapical X-ray is included in most root canal assessments. In complex cases, a CBCT scan — a three-dimensional imaging study that shows the tooth's canal anatomy in detail — is recommended and carries an additional cost. Rotary endodontic systems, which improve the precision and efficiency of canal shaping, are now standard at specialist clinics and are factored into the procedure cost.

## 5. Whether a Crown Is Needed

The root canal procedure cost and the crown cost are separate. In most cases, a crown is recommended after root canal treatment — particularly for molar and premolar teeth — to protect the tooth from fracture and restore full function. Budget for both when planning treatment.

### Typical Cost Ranges in Chennai
